REPORT BY THE COURSE COORDINATOR

COC Baking techniques is a two semester course offered by the Department of nutrition for IIyr students which is designed to enable the students to learn the basic techniques and science involved in baking and also about the various bakery products preparations.

This course was started by the Department of Nutrition for students of III rd & IV semester in the year 2016-17. In the current year 2021-2022, 102 students from various streams have enrolled in this course. A total of 21 classes were conducted in the IIIrd & IV th semester in the blended mode, out of which 9 theory and 11 practical sessions were held.

The classes were held Online using a Google meet on Tuesdays from 3.00pm to 4.30pm and in offline mode on Wednesdays, 1:20-2:45 pm.

During the course the students gained the basic knowledge of baking. They also learnt about the importance & usage of all baking ingredients.

The course also dealt with the practical demonstration of many bakery products such as various types of cakes, biscuits, doughnuts, pizza etc and the students were taught about the various equipment used in baking, baking problems & solutions & also about the types of icings used in baking.

The practical classes were taken by Mrs Shahnaaz Saleha, who was the course resource person. She holds nearly 22 years of experience in the field of baking. Apart from showing the preparation of various baking recipes, she also demonstrated various techniques involved in baking.

At the end of the course, assessment of all students was done by the Resource person Mrs Shahnaaz Saleha, course coordinator Mrs Y.V.Phani Kumari and Ms.Hannah Jessie Francis, Faculty, Dept. of Nutrition. The students performed exceptionally well and their efforts were appreciated by Dr.Sr.P.Amrutha,Principal,St.Ann's college and Dr.Smitha Asthana IQAC Coordinator. For the assessment each student prepared one recipe learnt by them during the course.

The students responded very well to the COC course as they gained the experience of various baking techniques and also got to know about the various bakery products.

This course is well accepted and appreciated by the students.It has ignited a spark of entrepreneurship in most of the students.



1. CAREER ORIENTED COURSE – BAKING TECHNIQUES

This course is offered by the Department of Nutrition,St.Ann's College for Women and has been developed to provide Second year Undergraduate students of different streams with knowledge and skills necessary to produce quality baked goods. This is a course designed to teach basic baking skills.

COURSE OUTLINE:

This course is a study of the fundamentals of baking including, dough, quick breads, pies, cakes, cookies and basic items made in a bakery. Topics include baking terminology, tool and equipment use, functions of ingredients, and the use of proper flours.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Upon successful completion of the course, the student will be able to:

Knowledge Based:

- Identify and explain baking terms, ingredients, equipment and tools.
- Employ safe food handling practices using contemporary guidelines

Skill Based:

- Scale and measure ingredients.
- Prepare yeast dough, quick breads, pies, cookies, cakes, icing and savory baking.

Course Learning Outcomes:

- Describe properties and functions of the basic ingredients used in baked goods.
- Weigh and measure ingredients used in baking.
- Scale, mix, mold, proof and bake yeast raised goods.
- Prepare cookies using various common dividing techniques.
- Demonstrate proper storage techniques for all baked products.

Report 2021-22

Report by the coordinator

A career oriented course **culinary Techniques** was started by the Department of Nutrition for students of III rd IV semester in the year 2016-17. In the current year 2021-22, 32 students from various streams have enrolled in this course. A total of 21 classes were conducted in the IIIrd & IV th semester in the blended mode, out of which 9 theory and 11 practical sessions were held.

During this semester the students got trained and received academic instruction on how to apply the knowledge and skills necessary for entering the catering Industry at a level allowing for continuing education and/or life-sustained employment.

As a result of instruction, students were able to know, comprehend and apply theoretical knowledge into practice. Apart from learning various methods of cooking and preparation of dishes from different cuisines, students have also learnt appropriate safety procedures and precautions necessary to successfully participate in cooking at home and in the catering industry.

During this course the students have learnt skills to practice time management and gain knowledge regarding costs of commodities in the market. They also learnt various cooking techniques and terminology used in cooking.

Students had a wonderful chef and guide in Ms. Varsha,Mrs Lakshmi and Ms Jessie of Nestle India Pvt Ltd, who were our resource persons from the industry. They all hold vast experience in the FMCG industry. Apart from demonstrating recipes they also impart education on appropriate food safety/sanitation procedures & precautions useful in a kitchen setting. She has also imparted knowledge on table setting, etiquettes and handling of kitchen equipment and technology necessary to participate in culinary skills.

The final Assessment of this course was conducted on 27th April 2022 by Mrs Francina Faculty from MBA Department of our college along with Dr Meena Kumari, Dean Admin and HoD Nutrition Department and Ms Nasreen Begum Course coordinator were invited as judges for final assessment. The students performed exceptionally well and their efforts were appreciated by Nestle India Pvt Ltd and all the students were given gifts and complementary hampers besides judging 3 best recipes which were awarded with gift hampers.







Benefits of angel investors over bank loan

The session started with a warm welcome to the dignitaries, faculty and participants then

handed over the session to Ms Siddiqua Begum to address. Ms Siddiqua began by explaining

a startup's stages - the idea stage, MVP stage, early stage, growth stage and scaling up stage.

She briefs about each of these stages step-by-step and explains the funding source and

valuation for each of them. She mentions how in the first stage of a startup, the funding

source is ourselves, friends and family, as they are the ones who would invest out of their

pure love, compassion and concern.

At the second stage of the startup, i.e., the MVP stage, the funding source becomes ourselves

and angel investors. Angel investors are wealthy private investors focused on financing small

business ventures in exchange for equity. The reason why they are called so is that even if the

startup goes in a loss, they do not take their investment back from them.

At the early level and all the stages that are followed, Pre-Series and Series (A-Z)

investments happen for a startup. If it scales up, it leads to having private equity, hedge funds,

banks and IPOs in exchange for the investment. Ms Siddiqua then moved on to talking about

what an investor looks for in a startup before investing. Some of these things include the Founder & the Team, the Story behind your startup, Growth Opportunity and Exit Strategy.

She then covered one of the most important segments of the session - the valuation of a startup. The six methods shown by the resource person include Book Value, Discounted Cash Flows, Market Capitalization, Enterprise Value, EBITDA and Perpetuity Formula. Each of these methods was briefly explained in a simple and concise manner. The final segment of Ms Siddiqua's talk was about what to look for in an investor other than money - their network, community, intellectual capital and enterprise in the field of your startup were the crucial things to look into.



Students and faculty of all the departments attended the session. The purpose of this session was to motivate and provide information to the students regarding lean start-up.

The session was started with Bible recitation followed by Prayer Song and then a warm Welcome Speech by Prof. Bhavani.

Mr Ganesh started the session by saying "Being an entrepreneur is asking yourself the "why?" question". He even asked "why" questions to students as well. Such as "why would someone do something without being interested and invested in it?".

If a person is not interested, he doesn't want to do that thing and if he is not invested, he will not do anything. Because our interests keep ourselves motivated and our investment will give us profit.

Ethical entrepreneurs are always famous for being brutally honest. Truth always prevails. In entrepreneurship we believe in God but rest everything is data. Entrepreneurship works on numbers.

Lean start-up is a technical term. Minimum viable product is like Greek and Latin.

Clarity in life is very important if we don't have clarity we can't reach where we want to reach. And to reach somewhere we need to have a vision, where we want to go? We depend on others and blame others. But entrepreneurship can't be like that we cannot depend on or blame others

Asks the question "why did you go to school?". We never ask, we don't have the habit of asking, we dint have the habit of questioning for which there is word called "stereotype". Choice is ours we want to be stereotype or unique.

You have the maturity to decide what you want to do? Which is the most essential question for anybody who is in academic area.

There are 2 essential words "USELESS" OR "USED LESS".

Spoke about few words. He answers to the previous question saying we went to school to "LEARN". The word Learn has alphabet "E" Once. Why did we learn? We learned for a "CAREER"; Career has alphabet "E" twice. To build a career what is the basic qualification an Individual needs? "DEGREE". Degree has alphabet "E" thrice. After that we aspire to become an "EMPLOYEE" which also has alphabet "E" 3 times. We kept growing from learning to degree. Entrepreneur has alphabet "E" 4 times. Scope for growing and we have grown. Life gives us indications, signals, resources, support system provided we have clarity. Entrepreneurship can't be forced or chosen; it must be lived. There is a season of entrepreneurship. Hyderabad has amazing incubators like WE HUB, T HUB, ALEAP, CIA and many more resources, we just don't have people wishing for it.

Last 10 years of his careers he was able to successfully incubate 13 start-ups. What defines you? Age grows we will have regret of doing something great. He worked with 2 global organization. One based in California the other in UK. He wanted to contribute to economic ecosystem of the country.

Spent 9 years in forest, quit his job in 2012 and settled in a forsaken place. Left the tag as an employee. He undermined himself. He made sure that people shouldn't be dependent on him they should be independent. He got 4 girls from our college as his mentees for a programme where he was invited mentor. The result of 8 weeks of programme was that they won best start-up at WE hub's pilot WE alpha programme. 2 start-ups from our college. We were lucky to have one of the start-up founders from our college our Alumni Ms. TANISHA from R19 Batch.

Learning is logical. Bluffing can't be done in entrepreneurship. Thinking different is the first step. Are you ready to be an entrepreneur? Lean start-up doesn't mean cheap start up. Lean is a framework, a method. A matrix, that helps you build your start up with least possible resources within the sparsest time. It is important to know that 1980's was industrialization 1990's was privatization was preferred 2000's information technology We created new word in 2000 "GLOCAL" 2010 everything changed, and another word was created "PHYGITAL" Entire world runs on 5 fingers.

In span on 30 - 40 years Inventions were considered important. Innovation came to picture. If something doesn't have value, is it necessary to change that thing. If you are innovating it has to have value. Value solves the problem or make it easier which was the objective of innovation. 2012-2013 shared his experience about his programme where he visited all villages on the sides of the highway. Walked till Warangal, took students together in sets. 5 sets of students. 23kms walk. Listen to problems and brainstorm for solution and come up with various solutions and the best ones were given a chance to work on the start-up.

Brigadier Ganesham had 22 patents in 6 byears, right use of knowledge.

Another programme in a village where there was a school with 204 students with 1 hand pump and they didn't get enough time to drink water. 9th class student use to work with his father on his agricultural land. The student presented his idea. 10 taps were installed and the problem was solved. We need observation that is called entrepreneurship.

If you are going to take this as your next leap start working on it now. Hyderabad has 22 research institutes funded by central government. ALEAP for Women Entrepreneurs. Rama Devi Madam. Asked the students about their plans. Student from BBA 2nd Year and 3RD Year came up with their ideas.

CONFIDENCE translates to "AATMA VISHWAS"

Spoke about the lean start up. Eric Ries wrote the book "THE LEAN START-UP" people who are interested in tech can read this book.

The definition of intellectual property rights is any and all rights associated with intangible assets owned by a person or company and protected against use without consent. Intangible assets refer to non-physical property, including right of ownership in intellectual property. Types of intellectual property rights include:

- Patents
- Trademarks
- Copy rights
- 1. <u>Patents</u>: The U.S. Patent and Trademark Office grants property rights to original inventions, from processes to machines. Patent law protects inventions

from use by others and gives exclusive rights to one or more inventors. Technology companies commonly use patents, as seen in the patent for the first computer to protect their investment in creating new and innovative products. The three types of patents consist of:

- Design patents: Protection for the aesthetics of a device or invention. Ornamental design patents include a product's shape (Coca-Cola bottle), emojis, fonts, or any other distinct visual traits.
- Plant patents: Safeguards for new varieties of plants. An example of a plant patent is pest-free versions of fruit trees. But inventors may also want a design patient if the tree has unique visual properties.
- Utility patents: Protection for a product that serves a practical purpose and is useful. IP examples include vehicle safety systems, software, and pharmaceuticals. This was the first, and is still the largest, area of patent law. Once someone creates an original work of authorship (OWA), the author automatically owns the copyright. But, registering with the U.S Copyright Officer gives owners a head-start in the legal system.

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



Aspiring women either take guidance from her in digital marketing& recruitment or learn from peer group. She connects them to different networks and knowledge session to scale of from homepreneurs to entrepreneurs. She mentors women, lateral entry into career by adding them to IT and freelance job groups maintained by her. Eg: UI Techies group could reach to 12 groups accommodating 2500 UI professionals 2 decades of multifaceted professional experience allows her to mentor and help women from all walks of life. She remains role model for many with her 2 decades diversified journey by breaking barriers in every phase of life from language to technical education shift to Technology shift jobs to not feminine works.
