Entry Feedback Report

2021-2022

- 50 % of the student's choice was influenced by the ranking of college in joining college, 29.4% by faculty, 33.1% by autonomous status, 26.7% by infrastructure, 30.1% by program options, 26.1% by sibling advice & 23.1% by other reasons.
- According to 86.2%, the admission counselling was helpful in choosing the right course whereas it was not helpful for 13.8%.
- 93.8% agreed that the choice of courses offered was satisfactory and 6.2% found it was unsatisfactory.
- 28.7% rated the information and guidance given during online induction programmes as excellent while 67.9% rated it as good.
- 95.6% concur that they did not experience ragging in the college (After Offline classes resumed).
- According to 59.3% of students, the teachers had good understanding in their academic aspirations, 34.7% felt that they had moderate understanding.
- 74.2% agree that the lecturers' teaching is very good while 2.6 % feel unsure.
- The laboratories are adequately equipped and properly maintained according to 63.9% while 33.4% opined that it is partly equipped .
- 63.1% think that CCA and SOC will provide a varied learning experience, 32.1% are hopeful, 6.4% are not sure.
- 38.6% agree that the library holding for their subject is excellent, 54.7% agree that it is good.
- 39.9% rate the student teacher relationship in the institution as very good, 49.3% good while 10.8% rate as satisfactory.
- 33.5% agree that the facilities for sports and other extracurricular activities are excellent, 43.5% agree as satisfactory while 23% think that it can be improved.
- 66.5% feel happy studying in an autonomous college, while 29.1% are somewhat happy.
- 41.4% were very satisfied with online classes held in the I semester and 49.5% were moderately satisfied.
- Above 88% strongly agree/agree that adequate online resources (like slides, notes, and soft copies of books) were provided by faculty while handling online classes, while 10.3% are neutral
- More than 65% opined that online classes were interactive, and it was easy to get the doubts cleared, while 23.2% remained neutral.
- 12.7% prefers mode of online Learning, 53.1% prefers offline while 34.2% prefers blended (Mix of Online and Offline techniques).
