Storytellers wander the countryside telling tales of the old world in return for some hot stew or a place to rest for the night, and the mythos of the new world starts to incorporate elements of the past. Would anyone here like to know how Kabul TODAY is? I'm an Indian. It has been a month since I'm here as far as I reckon. It doesn't feel so lonely. The very capital of the country Afghanistan; Kabul surrounded by occupied mountains of migrants who took shelter while the other cities were involved in wars, isn't how you imagine. So, no matter how far you are from your country, you always look on the streets with keen eyes to find someone who belongs to your land too. And how fortunate is that! I found a few! Group of people owning good number of commercial shops; selling Indian products especially, as well as of other countries; following Sikhism but are true Afghans. Speaking both the languages (Dari and Urdu) was quite amazing to know that their ancestors were all Indians and sadly now no Afghan is allowed to have citizenship of India and vice versa.

Apart from what people think of the "BLUE TENT" (that is what people out of this country call it: Burqa) you must know that here are the people who spread fashion. Every other human walking on the street is fully allowed to dress as they wish but following the hijab. Where ever you go, you always find beautiful and well-bred people.

Talking of the living here, follows the best of imported food, furniture, and clothing from friendly countries like Germany, Iran, Turkey, Pakistan, India, China and Italy. Lavish standard of living of the rich make them over protected and the poor who own nothing but brave hearts to fight for their own lives. When I look around, it feels like WOW! This place is yet so confident in spite of the extremes. Kudos to the patience of Afghans.

How can I forget? "Naan the Jaan of Afghan" probably is the one highly required edible thing without which they can't survive. And what? They always buy it almost every day. In the initial period it was hard for me to adapt to having low spiced food and thick breads to chew, where I mostly bit my tongue, but soon after few days I became used to the culture and after falling sick because of the weather I was at ease within a week. Whenever I pass across the street, there is not a shop, 1 among 5 consecutive where those giant lengthy naans aren't available. Size of the ice cream cone? Not less than 20 centimetres. Another type of ice cream called Sheer Yakh that includes one of prime ingredients i.e, snow brought from the mountains and literally serving it the whole spring. The snow is actually preserved until the season ends. Sounds crazy but tastes heavenly! Probably one of my favourites from Afghani sweets. Here food is very simple but tastes vary.

Would you still believe that there are and once upon a time there were people called Talibans? It all feels like a history to me; when I was about to be here, or get married to my husband many people constantly kept asking me to beware,

asking me questions like "Aren't you scared?" "What if you be one of the victims from the attacks or blasts there?", "How will you live in the whole so new world?", "How will you interact with people of some other language?", "Won't you miss your country?", "Will you ever come back?", "Why don't you live in safer place?", "How will you manage exchanging roti from naan?", "What if he (my husband) turns out to be from one of those Talibans?".

was so done with answering such questions of my friends and others. Of course I wasn't sure how Kabul is now, but somewhere I had that belief of not being in danger. It's all what they want to show you. But now it's all what I see and what I want to see.

Exaggerating agendas and manipulating people is what the media's job is. We all know that. Whatever I heard of Kabul being unsafe and blasts over blasts is not just. This country is still fighting and without it, that's never going to be peace forever. Everyone and everything is very normal here. Yes! People live here like in other countries. My husband has made me very tough to hear all such.

We sometimes hear sounds of gun fire, but I suppose that those are crackers and let it go! Hah! What I love are the old Russian vehicles, heavy and abandoned on the exact same place where they stopped working at the time of wars. Cops here are very dedicated. Security checkpoints are highly strict. Every picture exhibited on the posters has a big story. Unbelievable ones.

Of the things you might not know is that 1 in 500 vehicles is a bike. The most expensive cars here are in use because you don't have to pay taxes for most things. I miss long bike rides with my husband in Hyderabad. Prime reason for bikes not being used is because of dusty weather and layering of thick snow on roads. This place doesn't heat much, as much as the Indian summers. I'm in love with the weather here.


